John was one of the founders of the Dutch Snake Society, the first Treasurer, he started the Newsletter, was the author of a great number of articles, and everybody who had problems with his snakes could ask John for advice. In a speech at the funeral Pieter Stoel expressed this sentiment: "John was an example for many; more than he realised himself". This is the way in which John will live on in our memories. However, the Board of the Society feels that we must do something more to keep the memory of John alive: we have decided that the last issue of this volume will be a special memorial issue for him. After a short introduction about who John van der Pols was, two new articles from his hand will be published. Furthermore, everybody who feels the need, is encouraged to write an article (about snakes) specially for this memorial issue. I can only say: "I hope that this will become a very thick issue". When you have an idea for writing an article, please contact me, so that I will have an insight into what and how many articles I can expect for the memorial issue. Probably it is best to say that the promised articles must have reached the Editor by the end of July.
